#### DID YOU GET A PACKAGE YOU DIDN'T ORDER???

#### Experts warn of new 'brushing' scam.

Be careful about any PACKAGES that you didn't order or ones that don't have a return address and want you to scan a QR code: it could be a scam.

These so-called brushing scams have been around for a few years and there are a few varieties. They can range from a "victimless" crime to one that involves scanning a QR code to find out who the package is from.

That could lead consumers to a site tricking them into entering personal information, similar to a phishing scam. In some cases, malicious QR codes could also install malware to steal information from the consumer's phone.

DO NOT FOLLOW UP ON THESE REQUESTS. Do what you like with the item you received, just don't act on it! Be safe in the New Year and always.
