### FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

In that tridiuum, or three days, we also celebrate El Dia de los Muertes - The Day of the Dead. All of these are to honor and celebrate those who have died and gone before us.



All Saints is for the saints martyred throughout history for their faith in Christ, and for others who have died in the faith. All Souls commemorates ALL those who have died, including our own loved ones and community members. November is also home to Veterans Day (Armistice Day) when we honor all those who have died in wars, defending our country's and others' freedom. AIO NEWS — FALL 2024 - (Submitted by Pat Weaver) Hello AIO supporter and advocate

Sometimes it is hard to keep up with the seasons and the passing of time. Naively, I thought that with the Energy Assistance and Weekend Meals Programs on a hiatus, it would be quieter, but we filled the summer with a blur of events like the North Atlantic Blues and Lobster Festivals and programming enhancements like the addition of our food delivery van. Now with the expansion of Weekend Meals, the start of the Energy Assistance program, and a continuing increase in membership, AIO has been as busy as ever.

We're now up to 1,590 unique households who have come to AIO for services this year. Those households include about 3,775 people or about 9% of Knox County! Feeding America has estimated that 11.9% of Knox County residents are food insecure so while we are edging closer to the goal of insuring that no person in the County need worry about food or make the decision to skip a meal so they can get medical help, or stay warm, or pay for housing, we know there are still have more families in the community who need our help. Expanding awareness and reducing the barriers to accessing AIO services are constantly on my mind, and I am ever amazed and grateful for the passion, compassion, and dedication of so many who share the same desire to help others make it through the challenges of life.

In this newsletter you'll many stories and updates of all that is going on at AIO as we pursue this mission. Thank you for your support and I hope to see you soon.

I was told I was a late bloomer by those hanging right near me.
I was born in middle Spring at the top of an old oak tree.

We'd had some really wild rides with wind ripping about, it screamed and howled and whooshed right through, trying to make our strength give out.

Then on some days the rain would pour, it would literally make us glisten, and the steady drumming on our tree was more than we could listen.

Fall upon us, I was bedazzled with the colors we produced.
I tried to show-off my orange-red cape, my kingdom people were seduced.
I'd flutter under the cerulean sky — it made me feel so young,
but my days were numbered, I knew not why, my stem would not hold for long.

It was a day so brilliantly lit; we were all gloriously dressed — a breeze was teasing us to play, we flapped and showed our best. Then it happened, so gracefully, my steadfast anchor let go. I barely had time to say good-bye as I was cradled in the flow. I floated with ease up and down, a few somersaults I rolled, the breeze took me to the pond, I lay flat with perfect control.
