MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Happy New Year! No, you didn't read that wrong. It's NOT January 1st, but September. For some of us, the new year begins in September. Think of school starting, whether you are a student or teacher. It's also usually the beginning of the Jewish calendar, starting with Rosh Hashanah (New Year) and Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement). This year, however, the "new year" for the Jewish calendar is in October. According to Jewish belief, Rosh Hashanah is the birthday of the universe! It is the day that God created everything. Ten days after Rosh Hashanah (which varies from year to year because of the calendar), is the holiest day of the Jewish year, Yom Kippur. It is a time to reflect on the year, repent of wrongs we have done, and is a period of fasting and intensive prayer. These two holidays (holy days) typically fall in late September or early October.

While we typically make our "resolutions" and plans for a new year of living on the first day of January, this is also a good time of year to "take stock" of where we are, where we have been and where we are going -Individually - as a community - as a church.

Autumn is often seen as a time of transition - for the earth and all living things - animals, plants, trees. We can physically see the changes around us - sun setting earlier, brilliant green grass fading to a bit gold, leaves turning red and yellow, more geese overhead, etc. What might be the changes within US? How are we moving forward, letting go, changing?

September is a beautiful month - I call it a BONUS month because the weather is still wonderful, and we get to enjoy an elongated summer. Don't think of it as an end of summer and vacation -think of it as a time to begin new things, reflect and renew ourselves.

Recently while "deadheading" our beautiful garden, Irene Maxcy came across this fascinating creature.

The Praying Mantis.

Praying mantises don't actually pray in the human sense. Their name comes from their prayer-like posture, where they hold their front legs together as if in prayer. This posture is primarily a hunting stance, allowing them to quickly snatch prey with their powerful front legs.

Seeing a praying mantis could serve as a reminder of God's teachings about patience, mindfulness, and prayer. However, interpretations can vary, and it's essential to discern personal experiences in alignment with biblical principles. How can the praying mantis inspire Christians in their spiritual growth?

The world around us is brimming with signs and symbols that hold profound meaning, should we recognize them. The Bible is rich with symbolism, often using metaphors, analogies, and nature to express complex spiritual truths in simpler terms. A basic understanding of this symbolic language can be the key that opens up a deeper understanding of our spiritual life. Just like Jesus spoke in parables to convey profound truths, figurative language invites us to dig deeper, pushing us beyond the superficial to the spiritual.

The insect's name comes from the Greek word 'mantis,' meaning 'prophet' or 'seer.' When we look at the praying mantis, with its forelegs held together as if in prayer, it is easy to see why it could be associated with spiritual contemplation. Its demeanor invites us to reflect on the importance of patience, stillness, and openness to the divine will in our | spiritual journey.

Let's embrace the patience of the mantis, waiting on God's timing. Let's embody its stillness, making space for quiet reflection and prayer. In doing so, we draw closer to the heart of God, aligning ourselves more closely with His will.

MISSIONS ROAD TRIP

On August 7th, the Mission Board went to Boothbay to see first hand the trailers being reconfigured by Boothbay V.E.T.S. (Veterans Emergency Temporary Shelter). We met Ed Harmon, President, and Arthur Richardson, Vice-president, who took us on the grand tour. We were quite impressed with the operation, which is completely run by volunteers and incarcerated women. The trailers are temporary shelter, but the first step toward permanent housing for homeless veterans. At the present time 38 trailers are occupied. We heard Ed say more than once, "We never give up on anyone".

From their website: Our Mission is to provide short term shelter for homeless veterans who do not have immediate access to shelter. At the present, we are partnered with Maine Bureau of Veterans Services to identify current needs.

Our goal is to build a Veterans' Village where we can safely place 8-12 tiny house trailers and construct a community building, with restroom and shower facilities, kitchen, common room, and office space for social workers and clinicians to provide veteran services on site.

In October for Missionfest we hope to have Ed and Arthur here for a Mission Moment and perhaps one of the trailers on site. Missions made a donation on the day we visited, but will also be taking a special collection that day. We know you will be as impressed with their dedication as we were.


Upcoming Music Out in Our Community:


